Commission Rulemaking – Work Plan Development

SECTION 11. COORDINATED DATABASE #1

Member states must submit a uniform dataset to the coordinated database administrator on all individuals to whom the compact is applicable in accordance with the rules of the Commission.

? ENLC – agreements for data sharing, or included in rule?

What data elements are in the “uniform dataset”?

How are the data submitted?

What is the frequency of data submission?

Levels of access for the database?

Ownership of the data?

Decisions about what data can be shared?

Who owns the database?

SECTION 8. ADVERSE ACTIONS #2

Rule for member states to report to the Commission adverse actions and any occurrences where an individual’s compact privileges to practice are restricted, suspended, or revoked.

“Limitations on a license”

How this section links, impacts the Coordinated Database

Are adverse actions reported through the coordinated database?

What does “adverse action” include? Actions against the home state license or actions against the privilege to practice in other states?

What is the due process for adverse actions when it impacts the privilege to practice in other states?

Defining “restricted License”. Can this be due to crimes that will limit the privilege to practice?

What is the process for documenting the conversation between states for Section 8 B 1 of the compact?

How are adverse actions communicated to the Commission (Section 8 C)

What is the petition process to remote states? Is this possible (Section 4F)?

Can criminal history information be shared? If so, how? Can it be shared by the individual? Would the individual have to submit to a criminal background check in the remote state?

SECTION 3. HOME STATE LICENSURE #3

Rule that describes documentation that must be submitted by member state to verify criminal background check is conducted on all applicants for initial licensure that includes the use of fingerprint or other biometric checks compliant with the requirements of the FBI. Must include exception that federal employees who have suitability determination in accordance with US CFR §731.202.

Can we further define home state? What is the home state? (Primary affiliation?) Can an individual have more than one home state?

How are the results of the FBI check used to determine an individual’s privilege to practice in other states? Any felony is a disqualifier? Some crimes are felonies in some states and not in others. What then?

Is there a list of possible crimes? Does this list drive each state’s decision making on granting privilege to practice?

How does a home state communicate the privilege to practice to other member states?

SECTION 4. COMPACT PRIVILEGE TO PRACTICE #4

Rule for appropriate authority in the remote state to modify scope of practice of individual providing patient care.

States need to have authority to set scope, what does Alabama need to know from Wyoming as to what their scope of practice look like.

Member states make information available on scope for consideration.

Duration may drive, may not? Wyoming EMT Intermediates that intubate going into other states

Who is the appropriate authority? State EMS Office or local EMS agency? (is then an and/or” to be considered?”

How is the scope of practice modification communicated to providers?

At what point in time is a scope of practice change made?

Can a state implement an “across the board” scope modification? For example: no RSI for any remote state REPLICA medics.

How do states communicate the state SOP to other member states? Is the baseline the NSOP? Indicate any deviation from the NSOP?

How do remote states communicate their scope to other states if they have limited the scope from the NSOP?

SECTION 5. CONDITIONS OF PRACTICE IN A REMOTE STATE #5

Rule for appropriate authority in the remote state to assign EMS duties to an individual with a privilege to practice.
